Costs for both repair projects come in at over £100K, plus additional fees and surveys of various sorts, taking the total up to £150K or thereabouts. Although we are able to meet the costs, we need to continue fundraising so that we do not deplete our funds too much for the future. Watch this space!

Old Testament Reading: Jeremiah 17: 5-10

Thus says the LORD:

Gospel Reading: Luke 6: 17-26

He came down with them and stood on a level place, with a great crowd of his disciples and a great multitude of people from all Judea, Jerusalem, and the coast of Tyre and Sidon. They had come to hear him and to be healed of their diseases; and those who were troubled with unclean spirits were cured. And all in the crowd were trying to touch him, for power came out from him and healed all of them.

Then he looked up at his disciples and said:

'Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God.
